## FROM THE INTERIM RECTOR

### Now Is The Time

One of my favorite contemporary hymns, found in the ELW hymnal, begins: "Here in this place the new light is streaming." It's an apt hymn for All Saints', as we approach our 150th anniversary, and celebrate all the work we have done in the past few years to live into our mission to be a light to the world.

The hymn repeats the phrase "Gather us in" as a motif. This is what we hope to do on Wednesday, August 14, when we gather together for a catered meal as a parish, old and young, life-long Lutherans, cradle Episcopalians, and enthusiastic converts, those who are involved in the daily life of the parish, and those who drop in occasionally (and are always welcome!) We want everyone to know what's coming up in 2020, and find a place where they can be involved. This is the most important parish gathering we have had in recent memory—and it's free.

Here's what's on the horizon:

1. We will be welcoming a new rector, most likely at the end of this year. So, we will be starting our 150th year with new clergy leadership. Some have found God's timing in this process frustrating, but I believe it has been perfect—as God's timing always is, in retrospect. The new rector will be joining a healthy, reconciled parish. He or she will also have to jump in with both feet, not just wade in over time. This is a good thing. Working on projects together is a great way to get to know each other, and to build community.
2. We have the great responsibility and privilege of hosting Diocesan Council in February. This is an all hands-on deck event, led by a gifted organizing committee. There is a task for everyone, from sitting at a desk to hustling behind the scenes. As the hymn "Come, labor on" puts it, there is "no arm so weak but may do service here." There will be a way for everyone to contribute. It's an opportunity to show everyone in the diocese what a wonderful place Tupelo is, and what a loving, active, hard-working, joyful parish we are.
3. We are looking forward to the celebration of our 150th anniversary of existence as a church. We want 2020 to be a special, memorable year, where we can celebrate our past, dream of our future, and let all of Tupelo know how we have contributed to the quality of life for all people in Tupelo. We can join with our beloved Presiding Bishop Michael Curry in demonstrating that we are Jesus People, and that all are welcome here in this place.

So: Mark Wednesday, August 14 at 5:45 p.m. in the Parish Hall on your calendar and encourage your fellow parishioners to join you in this exciting event.

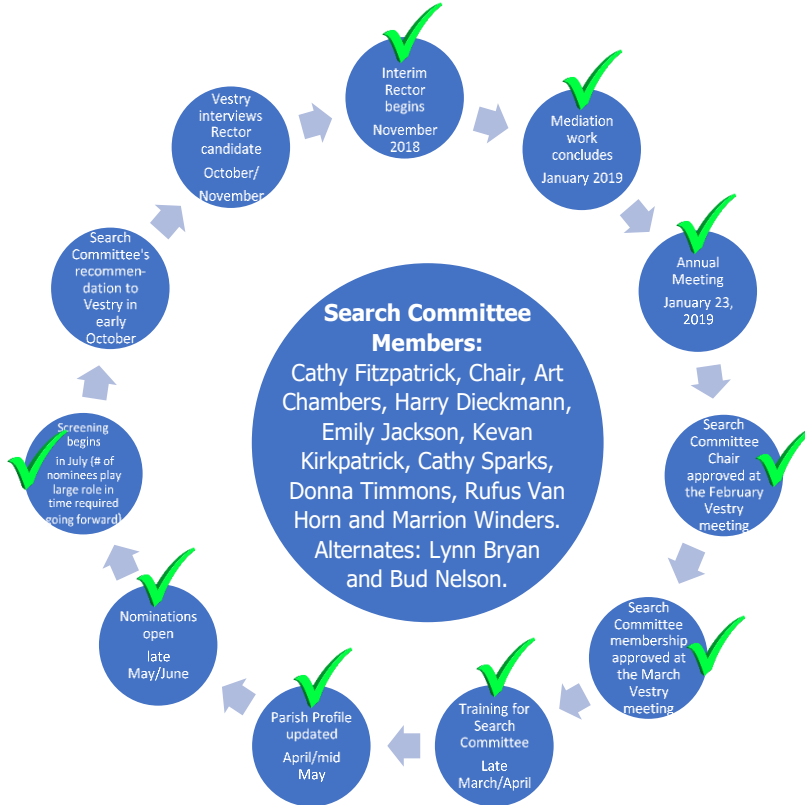
Here in this place, the new light is shining, now is the kingdom, and now is the day. Gather us in and hold us forever, gather us in and make us your own.

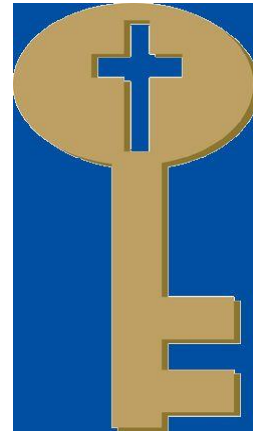

Since February, the Vestry has diligently worked through these proposals to make them agreements that will better serve the community of All Saints' and Christ the King, as well as the greater community. The final agreements and timelines were approved at the June Vestry meeting and have been compiled into a report to the Parish. June 25 – All Saints' Episcopal, St. Luke Church, The Orchard, Cooking as a First Language, and numerous All Saints' and community volunteers are holding 3 community dinners during the summer. Our first meal was Tuesday, June 25 and we served over 95 guests a nutritious, affordable, and accessible meal that they could recreate at home if possible.

We had a few new volunteers join us at Saints' Brew in June. We had two students from Tupelo Christian Preparatory School join us for a week of volunteering. The youth group at First Presbyterian also came and helped me clean and organize our closet that MUTEH and I use for community donations.

We have been very blessed over the last few months to receive monthly food donations from our food insecurity partners. We are especially grateful to St. Luke Food Pantry, F.A.I.T.H Food Pantry, and the Tupelo Lee County Hunger Coalition Gleaning Program. St. Luke United Methodist Food Pantry donated a large amount of cereal. Judy and Glyn Hester and F.A.I.T.H Food Pantry donate fresh fruit weekly. Tupelo-Lee County Hunger Coalition donated fruit and vegetables twice during June.

Bishop-Elect Kevin Strickland, after much prayer and discernment, has called Pastor Michael Jannett, Pastor Karen Boda, and Pastor Jill Henning to serve as Assistants to the Bishop effective September 1. A new Assistant to the Bishop and Director of Evangelical Mission will be announced at a later date.



Leaving the Synod staff in September will be Pastor Ben Moravitz and Pastor Dale Sillik, currently serving as Assistants to the Bishop, as well as Mr. Wayne Feel and Pastor John Mocko who are currently serving as Directors for Evangelical Mission. As Bishop-Elect Strickland stated, "These faithful servants have served the synod well, and we are stronger and better for them."

Bishop-Elect Strickland will begin his term on September 1 and will be installed as Bishop of the Southeastern Synod on October 5 at the Cathedral of St. Philip in Atlanta, GA. The new Assistants to the Bishop and other staff will be installed with him at that time.

## 2019 Churchwide Assembly to Elect Presiding Bishop and Secretary

The Churchwide Assembly meets every three years as the primary decision-making body of the ELCA. This year's theme is "We Are Church" and voting members will spend the week participating in plenaries, discussions, Bible studies and worship while deliberating the work of the church. Highlights of the work of this year's assembly include:

- Elect the presiding bishop and secretary. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, elected in 2013, is seeking re-election to a six-year term. Secretary Chris Boerger, elected in 2013, is retiring after this term. The secretary is elected to a six-year term.
- Act on "Faith, Sexism and Justice: A Lutheran Call to Action." The proposed social statement covers a range of issues in which the ELCA is called to action, including gender-based violence, workplace discrimination, economic inequality and more.
- Act on "A Declaration of Interreligious Commitment: A Policy Statement of the ELCA." The proposed document underscores the ELCA's long-standing commitment to interreligious relations and provides a framework for common application and theological reflection across the varied contexts of this church.
- Vote on proposed budgets for the 2020, 2021 and 2022 fiscal years.

We hope you'll join us at the Open House and let the children, along with our trained Catechists and Assistants, show you our beautiful atria and all there is to explore!

On Sunday, August 11 the Sunday Lectionary class will resume its normal meeting time of 9:30 a.m. in the south breakout room. (Sunday, August 4 we will meet at 8:30 a.m.)

In the long green Season after Pentecost, the lectionary readings focus on the Gospel of Luke. They will also focus on a series of chronological readings from the Old Testament prophets. Both the gospel

readings and this tour through the prophets offer rich texts to be wrestled with. The Sunday Lectionary Class meets every Sunday morning year-round in the south breakout room of the Parish Hall. Experience in presenting materials and help in preparing the catechist's album (or personal handbook) is also part of the formation course work. Many adults have said that the formation course has gone hand-in-hand with their EFM studies or that it has been like an in-depth Bible study for them and has helped in making our liturgy, music and scripture readings come alive. Our long-range plan for Catechesis has always been to have multiple trained Catechists who will work with our children in their Christian formation, and we'd love for you to be a part of that journey!

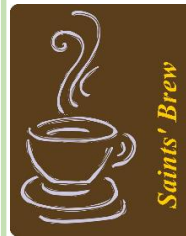

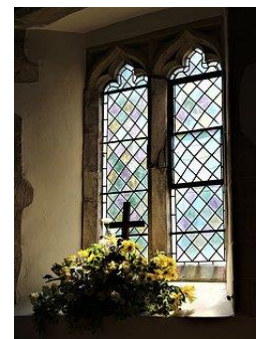
