

From the Rector

OLD TRADITIONS and NEW TRADITIONS

Thanksgiving Day, as I was growing up, went something like this. We watched Dad's favorite movie, the 1933 version of King Kong. We would eat Thanksgiving dinner. Then, Christmas came out. Boxes upon boxes of Christmas decorations that went all over the house. Our Christmas Tree, filled with thousands of ornaments, was put up. This was our tradition.

We didn't have Advent. It was Christmas all the way. It was Christmas from the end of Thanksgiving dinner until after the New Year. It wasn't until I was married with my own kids and we found our way to an Episcopal Church that we learned of Advent and attended Christmas Eve Mass.

A note from Sarah...

I have been a priest in the Episcopal Church since my ordination in March of 1996. It has been an eventful 28 years. My preparation and career as a priest has had its highs and lows, with times of joy, and more times of despair. I have come close to giving up more than once. But I have held fast to the promise God

gave the Israelites in Psalm 126: "Those who sowed with tears will reap with shouts of joy. Those who go out weeping, carrying the seed, will come again with joy, shouldering their sheaves."

My time spent with you all at All Saints' has brought me great joy. It's been the happiest experience of ministry in my entire career. Your love, affirmation, and acceptance have been a healing balm to my soul, a bountiful harvest after years in the wilderness.

I have seen you give this same welcome and encouragement to many others who have struggled with their faith or felt unwanted by their churches. Keep on doing the things you have learned and received and heard and seen . . . and the God of peace will be with you.

?? DID YOU KNOW ??



Did you know that if you're 70.5 or older and have an IRA, the IRS requires you to take a minimum distribution from your IRA? This distribution is taxable to you and depending on the size of the distribution

may push you into a higher tax bracket or cause your Social Security benefits to become taxable. You must take this distribution whether you have an immediate need for the money or not. To mitigate the tax impact, the IRS allows you to make a portion or all of the distribution payable to a qualified charitable organization, such as All Saints' Episcopal Church. To the extent that you have your IRA provider make the payment directly to the charitable organization (it cannot be paid to you and you in turn pay it to the charity), the distribution avoids taxation entirely and isn't subject to the standard deduction limit for itemized deductions. This benefit is available to anyone that is 70.5 and subject to taking a required minimum distribution from an IRA. As was mentioned at the Ministry Fair on October 9, All Saints' will fall short of having cash to make debt This required minimum payments in mid-2020. distribution benefit may be a means for you to help the church through that shortfall. Contact your tax professional for specific instructions for taking advantage of this benefit. It will be December 31 before you know it, so act quickly!





In October, 164 Saints' Brew volunteers served

1,838 meals

to individuals, families with children, those employed who are food insecure and homeless persons.

Immediate needs: Coffee, powdered creamer and sugar.

OCTOBER ACTIVITIES

Saints' Brew hit a huge milestone in October. As of October 14, Saints' Brew has served over 200,000 meals to the food insecure community of Tupelo and Lee County. We were featured in a wonderful Daily Journal article on October 25, 2019. https://www.djournal.com/lifestyle/religion/feeding-ministry-serves-meals-and-keeps-counting/article 144cbd7d-c18d-56b5-8f84-9d7ac465ce76.html

Coffee and Conversation was on Tuesday, October 1 and we had 18 attendees. Volunteers at Coffee and Conversation were myself, Sara Ekiss of MUTEH, Marcus Gary, the City of Tupelo Community Outreach Director, Rebecca Nelson of Volunteer Northeast MS, and Jason Martin of Tupelo-Lee County Hunger Coalition.

On October 10, the Thursday Saints' Brew volunteers, Scott and Bridgett Fleming, along with the generosity of Rotary Club of Tupelo and the Midnight Medical Clinic gave out free flu shots for our Saints' Brew guests. 10 guests are now prepared for the flu season. Many of our guests do not have regular health care insurance so offering preventative medicine such as flu shots can prevent long term health issues for our vulnerable citizens. They handed out hygiene supplies and donated the

remaining supplies to Saints' Brew to use as needed.

Deepika Dey has graciously donated her time and yoga training to create a donation drive for Saints' Brew. Deepika is hosting bi-weekly free yoga classes at All Saints' with participants donating goods to Saints' Brew as a "payment." Deepika's first two classes were Wednesday, October 16 and Wednesday October 30.

The Tupelo-Lee County Hunger Coalition and the MS Center for Justice held a food insecurity stakeholders meeting on October 29. All Saints' hosted the event in the Parish Hall with over 60 agency representatives in attendance. Through this event I was able to share the mission of Saints' Brew with multiple regional partners and to make connections with food insecurity partners at the state level.

St. Luke Food Pantry has been donating cereal on a very regular basis and gave us a large quantity in September. FAITH Food Pantry is also very generous with their regular fruit donation. Talbot House Bakery, which recently opened, is donating their delicious, homemade cinnamon rolls to Saints' Brew when they have extra that have not sold.

We still need volunteers! If you can volunteer Monday, Wednesday, or Friday, please let me know! We definitely need help on Mondays with cooking! Please let me know if you are an early riser and want to put your chef's hat on.

Keep in mind you must transfer the stock itself to the qualified organization rather than sell the stock and send the proceeds to the organization in order to take advantage of the benefit. PROCEDURES FOR NOMINATING "FROM THE FLOOR"

Nominations "from the floor" may be made in the following manner as set forth by the By Laws, Article III, Section 4 (Wardens) and Article IV, Section 2 (Vestry): "At least fifteen (15) days prior to the annual meeting of the Parish, [until December 31, 2019] any person entitled to vote at such meeting may submit additional nominations in writing to the Rector and the Wardens. The nominator shall certify that the person nominated has consented to the nomination and is willing to serve and faithfully perform the duties of the office. The Rector and Wardens shall confirm that the nominee is qualified under the By Laws. The qualifications are as follows: Confirmed communicants in good standing, at least twenty-one (21) years of age, pledgers of record, canonically resident and actually residing in the Parish, and entitled to suffrage at the parish meeting at which they are elected. If the Rector determines that pastoral considerations actually or acceptably prohibit a communicant from being a pledger of record, then in that event the Rector may confidentially waive the requirement. Persons nominated and certified under these provisions shall be presented at the annual meeting of the Parish on January 15, 2020.


