## FROM THE INTERIM RECTOR

December was a busy month for me, getting to know the staff, vestry, choir, Daughters of the King, and parishioners. Your hospitality has warmed my heart. I'm slowly learning your names, but keep reminding me who you are! And keep celebrating who *you* are—an open, welcoming parish with a faithful past to celebrate and a hopeful future to anticipate.

The mediation work is coming to a close and seems to have made a positive impact on the way various individuals and groups in the parish communicate with and understand each other. There are many exciting possibilities for ministry and parish care that have been identified. One of the challenges emerging from this work is the setting of priorities. It's tempting to focus on new ideas that are easy to implement, but it's important to focus first on the larger picture of what All Saints' and Christ the King have accomplished, and what must be done to make this parish a fertile ground for growth. The potential and intention are there, and you have done an amazing job of maintaining yourselves in this long period without a rector, but it's time to step up the prayers and actions to find the person God is calling to be your new, long-term (let us hope!) rector. I will do everything I can to help you in this process of discernment. I am your biggest fan. I've also been involved in countless search processes, so I know what questions to ask of a candidate. And I believe I have an understanding of the clergy personality and gifts that will be a good match for you all.

These are the priorities that have been identified as most urgent in 2019:

1. The successful completion of the Honduras Medical Mission.
2. Rector search—many of the creative ideas for new ministries will require the support of the new rector. It is only fair to allow that person the opportunity to participate in prioritizing and realizing these plans.
3. Organizing the 2020 Annual Council of the Diocese of Mississippi, which we will be hosting as we celebrate All Saints' 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary. This is an all-hands-on-deck project, and a great opportunity to get involved in the mission of the wider Church.
4. Capital Campaign—to free up funds for new growth and ministry.

Keep on doing what you are doing, with gladness and singleness of heart. And prepare to be surprised at what God will do—in good ways. As Bishop Howe of Central Florida often said, "God is seldom on time, but God is never late." Keep the faith!

## December 2018 activities included:


- Saints' Brew Team Lead meeting on Monday, December 3

In attendance was Christ the King's Emily Jackson, the current young adult lay representative on Council. Emily encourages anyone in the Atlanta area to stop by and visit the new space!

## 2019 - 400th Anniversary of Lutherans in North America!

The first Lutherans, in the form of Danish explorers, arrived on the North American continent in 1619, and have been coming ever since! The first waves of Lutheran immigrants were mainly from Germany and Scandinavia, but later on from Finland, the Baltic countries, Slovakia, Eastern Europe and Russia. More recently, Lutherans have immigrated from Africa, India, Asia and Latin America. The earliest Lutherans worked to organize congregations in the thousands and synods in the hundreds. These immigrants came with dozens of different Lutheran traditions, distinct in language culture, ethnicity, worship styles and theology. Lutheranism had never been done in English – and they wondered if it ever could be.

These questions occasioned conflicts and divisions, but also a strong reassessment of what was of primary importance in the Lutheran tradition and what could be learned from other Christians. The Lutheran core of word and sacrament found myriad new forms.

This is a history worth learning and celebrating. Not uncritically, for this history comes in all-too-human vessels. Equal parts celebration and repentance are called for, as Lutheran theology teaches that human beings are at the same time saints and sinners, and history shows this in great detail. Yet this same theology reminds that these Lutherans could only have done any of this with the guidance and help of the Spirit, who works with (and in spite of) our weaknesses.

Contemporary Christians dare not think of themselves as somehow better than those in their history. Equally, contemporary Christians should not despair, for God has done and can do marvelous things through humans. American Lutheran history is there for the taking!




