

Bishops' School is your opportunity to be with people who want to talk about God and to think theologically. In addition to interactive classroom times, small group gatherings, and service projects, there will be plenty of time for making new friends and having fun!

Unique to the 2020 Bishop's School event is that it will run concurrent with the Southeastern Synod youth event known as AFFIRM. 
