

From the Interim Rector

My favorite example of an epiphany—a dawning of the light—happened to a friend of mine who owned a wine store and was wondering why she was gaining weight. It suddenly came to her in blazing clarity—wine has calories! The reason I am here as your interim rector is an epiphany I had last fall—I can be their interim rector! You have the Holy Spirit to thank (or blame) for my presence.

I think of epiphanies as Aha! moments—things we should already know if we have been paying attention, or things that we have not been ready to perceive until the appointed time, as was the epiphany symbolized by the visitation to the manger from the Eastern sages that Jesus was born to save everyone, not just the Jewish people of God.

The older and wiser we grow, the more we are ready to receive truths that we might not have been able to grasp without life experience, especially the hurts and disappointments we all suffer. It helps to find a safe context in which we are open to receiving this truth. Often it requires soul work, and prayer, and someone who can help us face truths that we prefer to hide from ourselves. My beloved therapist//spiritual director/guru has been walking with me through my life story for the past two years, to shine light on events that need clarification and illumination, confession and repentance. You can thank her for my presence here as well.

My favorite set of prayers in the BCP are the prayers in the Marriage service. I find they provide a perfect template for how we are to treat each other in all aspects of life, as fellow Christians. I think they are especially appropriate to consider as we elect new vestry members and a new senior warden; for those who are taking on this sacred obligation; and for all the members of All Saints'; as the way for us to walk in love as Christ has loved us.

These are my favorite three prayers, which are the most germane to the ordering of our vestry:

- Grant that their wills may be so knit together in your will, and their spirits in your Spirit, that they may grow in love and peace with you and one another all the days of their life.
- Give them grace, when they hurt each other, to recognize and acknowledge their fault, and to seek each other's forgiveness and yours.
- Make their life together a sign of Christ's love to this sinful and broken world, that unity may overcome estrangement, forgiveness heal guilt, and joy conquer despair.

As you prayerfully consider your vote, be open to epiphanies. Look for candidates who are committed to this parish, who are creative thinkers, who are open to compromise. Consider the one who quietly does the work needed, and may see and know more than we do. Look for a broad representation of generations and experience, so that we have different voices and vision. And look for those who value the unity of this parish above their own personal needs and desires, just as married couples are called to do.

If these prayers are too deep for you, you can fall back on the Rotary Four-Way Test of the things we think, say, and do. I have preached on these ideals more than once. Choose people who you believe will make decisions with these goals in mind:

- Is it the truth?
- Is it fair to all concerned?
- · Will it build good will and better friendships?
- Is it beneficial to all concerned?

Epiphany is the season in which we celebrate the coming of the light. All Saints' has not exactly been the people who have walked in darkness for the past two years, but more the seed that has had an unexpectedly long germination. At any rate, we can live in hope with this promise from God:

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;

those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined.—Isaiah 9:2

PROCEDURES FOR NOMINATING "FROM THE FLOOR"

Nominations "from the floor" may be made in the following manner as set forth by the By Laws, Article III, Section 4 (Wardens) and Article IV, Section 2 (Vestry): "At least fifteen (15) days prior to the annual meeting of the Parish, [until January 8, 2019] any person entitled to vote at such meeting may submit additional nominations in writing to the Interim Rector and the Wardens. The nominator shall certify that the person nominated has consented to the nomination and is willing to serve and faithfully perform the duties of the office. The Interim Rector and Wardens shall confirm that the nominee is qualified under the By Laws. The qualifications are as follows: Confirmed communicants in good standing, at least twenty-one (21) years of age, pledgers of record, canonically resident and actually residing in the Parish, and entitled to suffrage at the parish meeting at which they are elected. If the Interim Rector determines that pastoral considerations actually or acceptably prohibit a communicant from being a pledger of record, then in that event the Interim Rector may confidentially waive the requirement. Persons nominated and certified under these provisions shall be presented at the annual meeting of the Parish on January 23, 2019.

- Saints' Brew hosted breakfast for Mission Mississippi, included 17 guests from area churches and community groups.
- Hosted Resume and Employment workshop with Tupelo High School Senior Project Group and Family Resource Center of North Mississippi with 13 attendees.
- Stanley Huddleston of Family Resource Center/Mt. Olive Baptist Church and Tom Wilson of Hope Church offered to serve and fund breakfast on Thanksqiving morning; 53 guests with multiple volunteers from both churches. Tom and Stanley are weekly volunteers on Fridays.
- A universal phone charging station has been provided in the north breakout room for our guests' use. Many times, due to loss or theft, they don't have access to a charger.

If anyone is interested in hosting a fundraiser for Saints' Brew please let me know. I am also looking to create a Fundraising Team for Saints' Brew. We always encourage and welcome food donations, however please let our Saints' Brew team know in advance in order to have the donated food served in a timely manner.


