From the Interim Rector

When I was young, my family attended Congress Heights Presbyterian Church in Washington, D.C. We had one service at 11:00 a.m. This was as God intended, as far as I knew. It was not until I became an Episcopalian that I learned of multiple service times to suit people's personal preferences: music or not, Rite I or 1928 BCP, early or later.

We did change the service time at Congress Heights in the summer, however. The church was not air conditioned, and D.C. summers are as hot and humid as the worst the Deep South has to offer. So in summer we had church at 10:00 a.m. It was still hot, and the hand fans with a picture of the nation's capital in the snow were not much help.

I confess I am still an advocate of one morning service, especially when the church has plenty of empty pews, which is often the case in the summer. Many church growth studies have shown that visitors are more likely to come back to a service in a church that is more than half full. I can produce theological arguments as well. In the reading from Acts for Pentecost, Luke writes: "When the day of Pentecost had come, they were *all together* in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability."

The entire group of believers was all together in one place, at one time, when the Holy Spirit made an appearance. *Everyone* witnessed the spectacular events, and *all* were all empowered for ministry. Imagine what might have happened if there had been two services, and the Holy Spirit had appeared at only one. As Luke describes the aftermath, all who witnessed the events were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others, the ones who weren't there, sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." Imagine what a rift that would have caused between the two congregations.


In the spirit of Pentecost, so that we can all have one worship experience this summer, and so we can get to know members of All Saints' and CTK whom we seldom see, we are going to celebrate all together this summer, at 9:30 a.m. We will still have one ELW service a month. The Sunday Lectionary class will meet at 8:30 a.m.

The summer schedule will begin, appropriately, on Pentecost Sunday, June 9, followed by a shrimp boil. We will end with a Back to School Bash on August 4. As an extra incentive, Taylor Sparks is taking hymn requests—not limited to the Hymnal 1982. We are going to have fun! Hallelujah, thine the glory, hallelujah, amen! Hallelujah, thine the glory, revive us again!

As we have been contemplating this schedule change, two verses of "Come, risen Lord", one of my favorite Anglican communion hymns, has been running through my head. I commend it to your reflection.

One body we, one body who partake, one church united in communion blest; one name we bear, one bread of life we break, with all thy saints on earth and saints at rest.

One with each other, Lord, for one in thee who art one Savior and one Living Head; then open thou our eyes, that we may see; be known to us in breaking of the bread.

April Activities

On Wednesday, April 3, Jill Rogers the Assistance Manager of Information Services at the Tupelo-Lee County Library, was present at Saints' Brew to inform quests of a new program that the library implemented. Learning Express is focused on developing interview skills and other workforce development skills and is completely free and accessible online at the library.

On April 4, 7 clients attended the Saints' Brew Legal Clinic and received legal advice on a wide variety of legal issues.

On Sunday, April 14, the All Saints' EYC made lunch bags for the guests at Saints' Brew. These bags included freshly prepared sandwiches and other snacks that made for an awesome gift to our guests. We were able to hand them out on Monday, April 14. The EYC regularly donates food if they have any remaining after their Sunday meetings and have volunteers frequently at Saints' Brew. We really appreciate our EYC!!

Jason Martin and a videographer visited Saints' Brew on Monday, April 22, to film footage for a promotional video that they are creating for the Tupelo-Lee County Hunger Coalition. Saints' Brew will also be able to use this video and footage for our own promotions and advertising.

We were able to order custom screen-printed t-shirts that would serve a dual-purpose. First, they are appreciation gifts for our diligent volunteers and secondly, we will be able to sell the remaining t-shirts for a small profit.

I attended the monthly All Saints' potluck in April and was able to share the service numbers and programming that we have accomplished since November 2018, when I became interim Saints' Brew coordinator.

Financial Notes:

Our 2019 Year-To-Date debits versus credits are not as in balance as I had planned or hoped for. Our YTD credits (or operations cost) is \$14,731.49 and our YTD debits (or donations) is \$8,971.00, which is a difference of \$5,760.49. This means we are spending more per month than we are bringing in. There are a few issues that have occurred over the last few months that can account for a large portion of this overage. In March 2019, Saints' Brew spent \$2,237.42 on the walk-in freezer compressor repair and in April 2019 we spent \$719.11 for the fundraiser t-shirts. We will recoup the cost of the t-shirts as we sell them. The compressor repair and t-shirts total \$2,956.53, which leaves a remaining \$2,803.96 of overage on food cost, supplies, and other Saints' Brew necessities. This extra cost is due to the fact that we have been serving more people since the beginning of 2019 than we were in 2018. Our original inventory and order forms were created using an average plate count of 80 per day. Over the last few months we have increased our average plate count to 100 plates per day. Also, it is typical for non-profits to experience a post-Christmas slump in charitable donations. It is now my responsibility to make-up for this overage through increased fundraising. Our budget is still very healthy with our current account balance of \$51,182.59.
