

FROM THE INTERIM RECTOR

Liturgical Changes for Lent

One of the greatest blessings of our Liturgy is the opportunity to capture the mood and theology of each particular season of the church year. To reflect the penitential tone of Lent, we will be making several changes in the liturgy.

- First, of course, there will be no Alleluias in the liturgy or hymns.
- The frontal (the cloth hanging on the front of the altar), stoles and chasuble will be purple—the traditional penitential color.
- We will begin each week with the Penitential Order, which features a recitation of the Ten Commandments, and the Prayer of Confession and Absolution.
- Instead of the Gloria, we will sing the Kyrie. The Sanctus and the Fraction Anthem will also change.
- We will be using Eucharistic Prayer 1 from *Enriching Our Worship*, a trial liturgy book. Attendees of the Wednesday noon healing service will be familiar with this prayer. I chose it because of the more penitential language in the body of the prayer.

On Ash Wednesday and the first Sunday in Lent, Blue Boxes for the United Thank Offering will be available for a Lenten discipline of offerings for gratitude, and/or breaking Lenten vows. (I give up remarking on other people's driving in Lent, and I might as well keep my Blue Box and a stash of change in my car.) This money goes to fund scholarships and grants in the Episcopal Church. A sacramental Lenten discipline might be attending the Wednesday noon healing service and Eucharist. **-Sarah+**

Welcome, Adam Stringer!

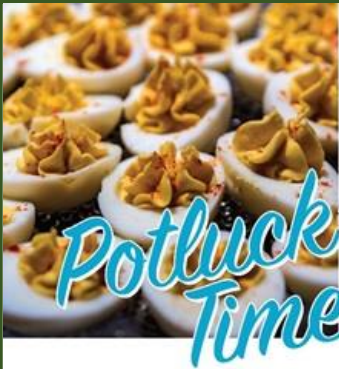

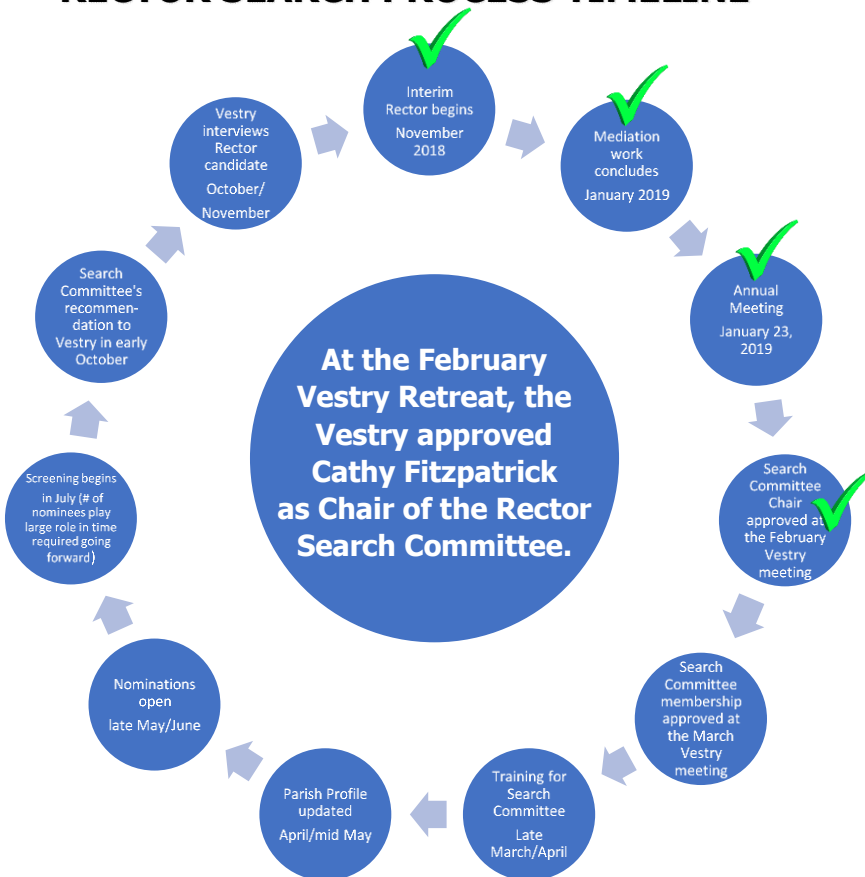

SAINTS' BREW JANUARY ACTIVITIES

Coffee and Conversation is held on the first Tuesday of the month at the Lee County Library at 9:00 a.m. The goal of Coffee and Conversation is to create a more socially minded program instead of being completely service minded. In January, Coffee and Conversation had about 15 attendees from our homeless and at-risk community.

Six individuals were taken to the DMV to get new IDs. I go to the DMV on the first or second Wednesday of the month. The funding used for IDs is a small donation given to the Homeless Task Force.

I attended the Tupelo-Lee County Hunger Coalition meeting and discussed upcoming projects with other food insecurity agencies in the Tupelo and Lee County area.

On Wednesday January 16, Saints' Brew was invited to attend a town hall meeting at First Presbyterian Church to discuss different non-profits and community-based programs in our area. I was able to share with First Presbyterian the mission of Saints' Brew and how individuals can get involved, either through volunteering, donating, or advocacy for the food insecurity and homeless.

I was invited to speak to the EYC group on Sunday, January 20 to discuss many different issues that can affect our vulnerable populations. Afterwards the EYC group pitched in and helped pack 75 care packages for Project Connect. Aidan Wilson and George Bryan

volunteered at Saints' Brew on the following Monday. They completely organized and cleaned our cereal storage area and helped clean up after Saints' Brew. They were a huge help!

All Saints' hosted Project Connect in January, which helps to connect the vulnerable population to resources available to them. Lunch was donated by Hope Church. We had 80 attendees at Project Connect and 100 guests for lunch.

The Point-In-Time Count is an annual census of the homeless population in the US. Saints' Brew is an official PIT Count site for Lee County. On Tuesday, January 29, members of the Tupelo Homeless Task Force met and implemented the homeless survey at Saints' Brew. This data will be used to track trends within homelessness in Mississippi, it will also help determine the grant funding that homelessness response agencies will receive in the future.

We are still looking for volunteers at Saints' Brew on Mondays and Thursdays and are having difficulty finding a full-time replacement for a few people who are out on those days. If you can volunteer, please let me know!

The Sunday Lectionary at 9:30 a.m. Led by Les Alvis

As March leads into Lent, the scripture passages coming up in the Sunday Lectionary Class include themes of wilderness and conflict, culminating at month-end with what many consider Jesus' most important and best-loved parable. These texts promise to make for engaging discussion. The Sunday Lectionary Class meets every Sunday at 9:30 a.m. in the south breakout room of the Parish Hall. Each gathering begins with a presentation of the day's Bible readings followed by lively conversation. Consider taking up the Sunday Lectionary Class for Lent. CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD Sundays at 9:30 a.m.

Level I: Children ages 3 years – 2nd grade

Level II: Children in 3rd – 6th grades



The children in Level I will explore Psalm 23, to give them language for prayer in response to God's abundant gifts. They will also explore the gestures of the Eucharist, such

as the Epiclesis. The aim here is to introduce the gesture and the prayer of Epiclesis as a sign of asking God for the great gift of His presence in the bread and wine and to connect what happens to the bread and wine in Holy Eucharist, to what will happen to all creation at the Parousia. As we move through Lent, the children will explore the parable of the Grain of Wheat and how Jesus used this parable to show that growth and transformation occur as a result of change and that we share in Christ's death and resurrection through the fruit of our lives.

The older children will revisit the parable of the Good Shepherd and ponder anew His love and complete devotion to His sheep, now adding the verses about the wolf and hireling. This parable acknowledges how the Good Shepherd conquered evil and death and puts himself in front of us to protect us, as well as making a connection with the Passion and Resurrection of Christ.

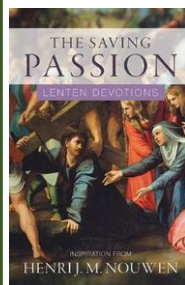
