

# From the Rector

We have gracefully moved through the season after Epiphany and entered into the season of Lent. Lent is called a season of penitence. A time for us to reflect on our journey with Christ and our union with God. However, for many, Lent has just turned into a time when we have to give up something like chocolate. But, is Lent only about fasting?

Speaking of fasting, here is just a little trivia for you. The reason why pancakes became associated with Shrove Tuesday is all about fasting. It makes sense that if you are fasting, you do not want those things which you are fasting from around in your house. Have you ever gone on a diet and went to a birthday party? You know you are going to have some cake. So, people who are fasting would try to get rid of "this stuff" before Lent started. Pancakes are easy to make and used eggs, milk, and sugar. All the good stuff that people traditionally would fast from. Making pancakes became a way to empty the cupboards and have a little celebration before the 40 days of Lent.

Lent is more than just giving up, for a few weeks, something that we love but can live without. Lent goes deeper than just giving up chocolate or coffee. In the book, *The Liturgical Year: The Spiraling Adventure of the Spiritual Life*, Joan Chittister writes that, "Lent calls each of us to renew our ongoing commitment to the implications of the Resurrection in our own lives, here and now." Lent is a time when we are called to spend time reflecting on Christ's life, death, and resurrection and how we have been interwoven into this mystery that is Christ. Lent is a time to reflect on how our lives are interwoven with Christ so that we may prepare ourselves to participate in Christ's death and resurrection. This, of course, is Holy Week and Easter. Lent, therefore, is a season of penitence but it is also a season of preparation.

Often, we get into a daily routine. Most of us get up in the morning, prepare breakfast, get everyone out the door to go to where they need to be for the day, go to work, lunch, work, go home, prepare dinner, watch tv, get everyone ready for bed, sleep, and repeat. It is easy to get into a rut in life. A rut that just makes life go by without us even realizing it. Chittister reminds us, "Lent is a call to renew a commitment grown dull, perhaps, by a life more marked by routine than by reflection." Lent can be a time for us to break out of our routines and spend time reflecting on our life with Christ. A time to see the world as it is and how it could be.

For us here in the South, Lent often begins during that time of the year when darkness and dreariness of winter is still with us. However, as we move through Lent, the signs of spring begin to emerge. Our reflection on our life with Christ can simply be to reflect on how routine and dreary our life can be when we fail to see Christ in our life and how there is newness to life when we are open to our journey with Christ. Even if we just become mindful of Christ in our mundane daily routine, that routine opens up and blooms into something that can renew our faith.

The season of Lent has been a part of church life since early in the history of the church. We know that by year 330, many were participating in some form of Lenten practice. Christians have observed this important season of reflection even before the celebration of Christmas was commonplace. This year, even if you decide not to give something up for Lent, take time in your busy daily routine to be mindful of how Christ is with you in your life. Spend some time each day in prayer, read Scripture, or just sit in quietness and listen for God. This will prepare you to a life with the risen Christ of Easter.



Coffee, sugar, powdered creamer and cereal

- January 7, volunteers at Coffee and Conversation were myself, Sara Ekiss of MUTEH, Marcus Gary the City of Tupelo Community Outreach Director, Rebecca Nelson of Volunteer Northeast MS, and Jason Martin of Tupelo-Lee County Hunger Coalition.
- City of Tupelo Homeless Outreach Team met January 7.
- Northeast MS Regional Homeless Coalition met January 10.
- On January 13, Albert White attended the United Way Agency Interviews on behalf of Saints' Brew. The panel interview is one of the last steps before United Way makes its funding decisions. Albert was able to share our Saints' Brew Annual Report with United Way and help pinpoint our goals performance measures for 2020 and 2021.
- The largest event that Saints' Brew was involved in was Project Connect, held on January 27. It is a resource fair organized by the Tupelo Homeless Task Force and the Mississippi Balance of State Continuum of Care Homeless Coalition, which is our state-wide coalition. Saints' Brew is a member of both the task force and the state coalition. Project Connect was hosted in the Parish Hall of All Saints' and Monday's Saints' Brew crew were generous enough to stay later and help transition between Saints' Brew and Project Connect. Project Connect is a large resource fair with over 27 service providers present to help connect attendees to employment, education, housing, legal advice, mental health resources, and even haircuts and socks and underwear. We also served lunch during the Project Connect, which was donated by Stephanie Johnson (the Director of SAFE Inc.'s small group at The Orchard). We had 35 attendees at Project Connect and about 80 guests for lunch.
- The annual census of the homeless population in the US is the Point-In-Time Count. Saints' Brew is an official Point-In-Time or PIT Count site for Lee County. On

Tuesday, January 28 members of the Tupelo Homeless Task Force including The MS Balance of State Continuum of Care, Mississippi United to End Homelessness, and the Mayor's office met and implemented the homeless survey at Saints' Brew along with other areas in Tupelo. This data will be used to track trends within homelessness in Mississippi, it will also help determine the grant funding that homelessness response agencies will receive in the future.

- Saints' Brew and All Saints' were included in the media coverage given to the Project Connect and Point-in-Time Count. - Our coffee brewing system has been offline for the past few weeks. Each day we make multiple gallons of coffee for over 100 guests. A new brewing system has been ordered, but it is very pricey so if anyone would like to donate specifically to help cover that cost it would be greatly appreciated!


