



Back when I was going through my Pentecostal phase in the late 1990s, I had the privilege of hearing Bishop T.D. Jakes, a black Pentecostal preacher, speak at an interdenominational women's conference in Orlando on how God rescues us from bondage. He talked about Pharaoh's chariots pursuing the Israelites, bearing down on them as they stood on the shore of the Red Sea. These were no everyday chariots, he explained. Pharaoh sent his best chariots, his customized hot rod chariots, after the Israelites, because he wanted to make sure to catch them. In the same way, when the devil tries to keep us in bondage, Bishop Jakes went on, he does not send a run-of-the mill chariot after us. No, he sends a customized chariot with just exactly what it takes to catch us and drag us back.

It had been a long conference, I had a headache, and I was sitting with my eyes closed in a sea of shouting, clapping women. When I heard those words, my eyes popped open, and so did my ears. I knew about those chariots. It made sense to me, now that I thought of it, that many of my fears were sent by the evil one to diminish my trust in God, to make me doubt God's graciousness, and to make me doubt myself. I set out to identify my own customized chariots.

It's often in the middle of the night, when our defenses are down, that the devil sneaks in. I used to wake up at four in the morning worrying about money, but through God's grace, and unfailing provision, I've let that go. But the devil still knows when to take advantage, in that less-than-rational fog between sleeping and waking. The devil has well-chosen backup chariots—worries my aging body, my aging brain, upcoming sermons, the state of the world.


Even before I heard T.D. Jakes' sermon, my favorite book of the Bible was Exodus, especially when Moses stands on the shores of the Red Sea and attempts to calm the panicky Israelites while Pharaoh's chariots bear down on them. The Israelites whine to Moses, "It would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness." Moses replies, "Do not be afraid, stand firm, and see the deliverance that the LORD will accomplish for you today; for the Egyptians whom you see today you shall never see again. The LORD will fight for you, and you have only to keep still." (Exodus 14:12-14)

The devil knows if he sends his customized chariots after us, our tendency is to panic. We either try all sorts of ineffective solutions, or we fall into despair. We lose focus; we can't concentrate on the task at hand. We find ourselves facing what looks like an insurmountable barrier. But we can trust in God's promise that God will fight for us. God will banish whatever that chariot represents from our lives and bring us out of bondage. God will save us.

God wants to deliver us from bondage. We do not have to live in panic and despair. God will fight for us, against the devil. God will deliver us out of captivity to the other side of the Red Sea, to the promised land, where the devil's chariots, forever washed away, will no longer have power over us. Thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

EMILY JACKSON





March Activities

In December 2018, The Northeast Mississippi Medical Society made a very generous donation to Saints' Brew. They also invited me to be a guest speaker at their Spring meeting. I was able to share with the group the mission of Saints' Brew and how their donation would be used to fight food insecurity in our community and how they could be further involved through donations and advocacy.

- I met with the Mississippi Balance of State Continuum of Care Coalition that is held once a month at All Saints'. We had organizations from Corinth, Columbus, and other areas in the northeast in attendance. I was able to give new attendees a tour of the Saints' Brew area and share our mission and programming with them.
- I am a member of "Tupelo Rocks" which is a group of young entrepreneurs, community leaders, artists, and enthusiastic citizens who are taking an active role in helping Tupelo meet its full potential. The goal is to turn complaints into solutions and ideas into realities in an effort to retain young residents in Tupelo, while attracting visitors and new residents from surrounding communities. We want to unify, energize, and strengthen Tupelo with community-wide events, public art projects, civic improvement, and ideas that inspire passion and excitement. During our March meeting they asked me to share with the group all the efforts and opportunities that we are creating in addressing food insecurity and homelessness in Tupelo. I spoke to the group at length about Saints' Brew. We even had a few members volunteer and donate items in the weeks after this meeting.

I attended the City of Tupelo Homeless Task Force meeting on March 21.

- I was invited to be the guest speaker at St. Luke's Food Pantry Volunteer Appreciation lunch. I discussed food insecurity and homelessness with their group.
- "10 for Tupelo" is a day for the citizens of Tupelo to make a difference in their community by volunteering their time in the form of litter cleanups and beautification projects for a portion of 10 hours of straight service. "10 For Tupelo" is organized by Keep Tupelo Beautiful and the Rotary Club of Tupelo. I was able to give Rebecca Nelson, Director of Volunteer North Mississippi, Saints' Brew brochures and resource guides to handout during the event.
- We had numerous community food donations during the month of March. These donations are very valuable to
 our mission because it offers fresh fruit and other types of food that we are unable to include in our budget or
 purchase ourselves. It is also an important part in our goal to increase the amount of food recovery in our
 community. Food recovery is diverting viable and edible foods from the landfill to those who need it most.
- Faith Food Pantry has been absolutely amazing to Saints' Brew over the last few months. Judy Hester is very involved with Faith Food Pantry and has been a diligent volunteer at Saints' Brew on Wednesdays. She and her husband pick up fresh fruit from Faith Food Pantry almost weekly and donate it to Saints' Brew. All the fresh fruit we have had over the last few weeks, apples, grapes, watermelon, oranges, tangerines and honeydew melons, is due to their generosity. We have even had fresh vegetables like cherry tomatoes that we were able to give to the guests to take home with them. One of my biggest goals for Saints' Brew is to find a way to include more fresh fruit on our menu. Since fruit can be quite expensive we would be unable to purchase it. The partnership between Faith Food Pantry and Saints' Brew has been a wonderful blessing!
- Addiction Recovery Resources receives pastries from Starbucks for their addiction support meetings. Leftover pastries not used at their meetings are donated to Saints' Brew.
