The Rev. Phillip Parker



From Search Committee member, Cathy Sparks:

Very quickly into our interview with him, he proved to be open and honest about himself. It became clear to me he was called by God to be our next rector.

From Search Committee member, Bud Nelson:

What impressed me the most about Phillip was his inner strength. He is clearly a person of deep convictions and great tenacity, who is able to have a deep disagreement with another and still be able to work together and come together at the communion table. He listens deeply. He cares deeply. I believe his previous work with marginalized persons, prisoners, and others with differing needs will inform his ministry among us. I suspect that younger people will be drawn to him, and he to them. But regardless of age, I believe he can meet us where we are. He has what I like to call that Ministry of Calm Presence. I can see him celebrating with us; I can see him grieving with us. My heart is telling me he's the right choice.



VISION 2020

As we begin November, 99 households have committed \$496,728 to the 2020 Operating Fund. We're very close to our goal of \$525,000. More commitments are needed this month to take us to the finish line.

Meanwhile, 70 households have committed another \$678,110 over the next five years toward reducing the debt on our buildings. We're still short of our need of \$1 million. Broader participation in this effort will help meet this need. But *now is the time* for that participation.

??DID YOU KNOW??



Did you know that if you're 70.5 or older and have an IRA, the IRS requires you to take a minimum distribution from your IRA? This distribution is taxable to you and depending on the size of the distribution may push you into a

higher tax bracket or cause your Social Security benefits to become taxable. You must take this distribution whether you have an immediate need for the money or not. To mitigate the tax impact, the IRS allows you to make a portion or all of the distribution payable to a qualified charitable organization, such as All Saints' Episcopal Church. To the extent that you have your IRA provider make the payment directly to the charitable organization (it cannot be paid to you and you in turn pay it to the charity), the distribution avoids taxation entirely and isn't subject to the standard deduction limit for itemized deductions. This benefit is available to anyone that is 70.5 and subject to taking a required minimum distribution from an IRA. As was mentioned at the Ministry Fair on October 9, All Saints' will fall short of having cash to make debt payments in mid-2020. This required minimum distribution benefit may be a means for you to help the church through that shortfall. Contact your tax professional for specific instructions for taking advantage of this benefit. It will be December 31 before you know it, so act quickly!


